Paid leave: During the 2017 legislative session, I was the primary sponsor of paid sick leave legislation that was vetoed by the governor. I was also primary sponsor of legislation that required Nevada employers to provide leave to employees who are victims of domestic violence or whose family or household members are victims of domestic violence. As Senate Majority Leader, I have co-sponsored legislation expanding access to birth control, co-sponsored a bill to codify the Affordable Care Act's women's health protections into state law and voted to establish a state-funded family planning grant. Increase minimum wage: During the 2017 legislative session, I supported two measures aimed at increasing the minimum wage -- one which was ultimately vetoed by the governor, and one that will likely be on the ballot in 2020. According to SJR6, if passed by the legislature in 2019 and approved by the voters in 2020, NV's minimum wage For the last few years, the attorney general's office led by Wes Duncan and Adam Laxalt has consistently sided with big corporate interests over Nevada's families and workers. They've run an ideological war out of the AG's office, siding with Donald Trump and their big donors over the people. It's time for a fresh start in Nevada's Attorney General office, and it's time for an Attorney General that puts families over ideology. My campaign is about keeping Nevadans safe, strengthening the middle class, and protecting families. I'll take on scammers who rip off our seniors, insurance companies that deny care, employers that steal wages from their workers, and criminals and drug dealers who prey on our communities. There is no criminal too ruthless and no corporation too powerful that I won't take on if they are hurting Nevada's families. As Senate Majority Leader, I have shown my support for these issues including increasing access to affordable birth control and family planning, increasing the minimum wage, and equal pay for equal work. In the last legislative session, I led the charge to improve the legislature's sexual harassment policies, and the first policy plan released in my campaign for attorney general was a plan to
